Weeding is also important to avoid increasing the cost of maintenance for the presentation, maintenance and archiving cutting the cost of human power. It is necessary to weed the heavily damaged and unused reading material particularly torn and damagedold books not usedfrequently by users and remain on open shelves. Building for continuously growing new books will not be feasible for every institution therefore such materials are weeded out.

- To make upto date collection
- To make it advanced and easier for staff users to use
- To meet the latest and required demands of the uses
- To save the human resources & time of collection management

Guidelines of the National Knowledge Commission to the Library Regarding Collection Development:

The National Knowledge Commission is a high-level advisory body formed by Government & India to guide and design reforms to focuss on important areas such as education, industry, technology, Agri and e-government. The commission designed the roadmap and policy for fruitful growth in the field of education particularly focusing on the development of academic libraries. As per guidelines issued by the National Knowledge Commission (NKC) regarding collection development and evaluation of collection and services, all libraries must develop their core collection to satisfy the user community's needs. The libraries must maintain better qualitative and quantitative standards.

The important recommendation of the commission regarding academic libraries is to form a library commission. The library collection must be dynamic and relevant to the users. The body also focused on the importance of the weedingpolicy and its implementation in libraries and weeding out of books should be the mandatory process. The weeding policy should be developed to weed out outdated and torn books every five years. Libraries & Librarians should be careful regarding the selection of reading material and its appropriateness to the requirements of the users, faculties have to suggest by the library to avoid unused, useless, torn collections.

- 2. All heads of the departments (HOD) as members
- Librarian as Secretary

The list of weeding material recommended by the library committee shall be placed before the executive committee of the college headed by the chairman of the SonopantDandekarShikshanSanstha including secretaries of the Sanstha to examine the weeding out report endorsing the recommendations and again sent to the Librarian for the weeding out processing. Before weeding, the reading material will be exhibited in the college for the faculty and students in the form of a weeding-out books exhibition. At that time of the exhibition faculties & students will select the reading materials useful for them and purchase for their personal use at their own cost. The remaining reading material will be kept for further processing and will be discarded from the present stock.

Criteria for Weeding:

- Textbooks that are not currently taught must be withdrawn
- Reading material which is damaged and out of repair condition must be withdrawn
- If the damaged material is out of publication or rare may be considered to transfer to the archaeology collection
- The material which is with low circulation must be withdrawn
- Books And the content which is out of date must be weeded
- Old reading materials when the latest prints are available and procured must be weeded out
- Unused collections by faculties and students to other users are ugly, worn beyond repairIrrelevant to the needs of the users must be withdrawn

Conclusion:

It is found that the weeding policy and practical approval of R. H. Save Library SDSM College are proven important aspects in the collection development about making space for the new arrivals following standard national international, National Knowledge Commission and UGC norms. The wedding policy applied in the library resulted from its selection of space human resource problems focusing on the user's satisfaction by providing updated reading material most easily.
