Abstract

A study was conducted to look for developing potential ecotourism places in Palghar. The Species Diversity of insects was studied in Palghar. Palghar is famous for sea coast, gardens. M.I.D.C.(Maharashtra Industrial Development Corporation) hilly areas and forest. These hilly areas and forest supports wide variety of insects and butterflies. The present Study on biodiversity of insects was conducted at four sites college Road, forest college garden and BIDCO (industrial area). About 30 different species of insects including butterflies, Moth and larvae were recorded during investigation. Butterflies belonging to five families namely–Nymphalidae, Pieridae, hesperidae Lycaenidae and papilionidae , were found all along the study area.
